

Message from the Executive Director Sonja Zacharko

The staff and volunteers at Edmonton Meals on Wheels are driven to improve food security for our community. While we remain dedicated to serving seniors as well as vulnerable and socially isolated individuals, we are determined to support all individuals experiencing barriers to accessing nutritious meals.

The continuing surge in food and utility costs means that more people are struggling to eat. Recent reports indicate that in 2022, 20.3% of Albertans experienced food insecurity; in 2023, 63% of Edmontonians felt that it was more difficult to afford groceries over the year. Edmonton Meals on Wheels has begun connecting more broadly with community agencies, ensuring they're aware of the availability of our low-cost, nutritious meal programs. Last fall we launched our grab-and-go freezer in the foyer of our building, increasing the immediate access to wholesome meals when people need them.



2023 was a year focused on resilience for our clients, volunteers, community partners and staff. We maintained our focus on safe food preparation and delivery, and with pandemic restrictions lifted we maximized our ability to socially connect with each other again. We returned to sharing smiles and having longer conversations with meal drop offs – something we missed since early 2020.

I am thankful for the unwavering commitment from our volunteers, donors and staff who make our important work possible. Our Board of Directors' strategic leadership is instrumental in ensuring we stay committed to our mission of nourishing communities by delivering fresh, thoughtfully prepared meals, fostering connections and promoting well-being. Looking ahead, we are well-positioned to offer consistent meal services while working in collaboration with our community partners to ensure we improve food security in our communities.

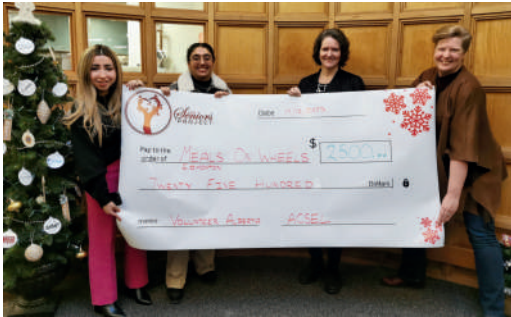

Treasurer's Report

The Board of Directors is pleased to present, for your approval, the financial statements of the organization for the year ended December 31, 2023. The audit report, similar to previous years, affirms that we are following Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations in an appropriate manner.



The past year continued to pose challenges for the organization as food inflation continued to rise. The increased costs were projected at the end of 2022 for 2023 by the organization, and as a result, the organization raised prices on its products and services for the first time in many years. Due to this measure, and the hard work by staff and volunteers, the organization was able to decrease the operating deficit from \$469,845 in 2022 to \$309,644 in 2023.

The organization's investment portfolio recovered from the unprecedented unrealized losses of \$319,359 in 2022 to an unrealized profit of \$159,535.

Investment income also rose from \$112,848 in 2022 to \$167,112 in 2023. The robust performance of the investments resulted in an overall surplus of \$17,710 in 2023 compared to a shortfall of \$676,356 in 2022. The organization has kept an internally restricted fund of \$2,734,000 which was set up in 2022 for various items listed in the notes to the financial statements.

The operational efficiencies show how much the volunteers and donors contribute, and the Board of Directors is grateful for their ongoing help.
